

Welcome Home Act – 2024

Reciprocal Architect Licensure

Applicants may qualify if **all of** the following apply:

1. They hold a current and valid architect license in another state.
2. They have held the architect license in the other state for at least one year.
3. The other state required the applicant to pass an examination or to meet education, training, or experience standards.
4. The other state holds the applicant in good standing.
5. The applicant does not have a disqualifying criminal record as determined by the board or under state law.
6. The applicant does not have a disciplinary action or investigation pending in another state. If so, we will not issue or deny a license until the action or investigation is resolved.
7. The applicant pays all applicable fees associated with the license.
8. The applicant lives in this state and provides proof of residency by producing proof of one of the following:
 - a. A current state-issued ID card.
 - b. A state-issued voter registration card.
 - c. Documentation of current in-state employment or a notarized letter of promise of employment of the applicant or his spouse. If an applicant uses this method to obtain licensure, we will require another form of proof of residency listed, six months after licensure is granted.
 - d. A current homestead exemption for this state.
